My 6 year old concert-going hero

At the November 2018 Concert (Beethoven 5 conducted by Karina Canellakis) there was a young man about 6 or so years old in row B in the central section, his seat number would have been in the 30's. At the end of the first movement he quietly and spontaneously applauded. I was so impressed that *he* was so impressed by the wonderful music and music-making! The little dear did end up napping on the floor a bit later on, but it was a joy to this older person to see such exemplary behavior and appreciation of fine music in one so young. Good on you young man – *and* your parents!

Karina Canellakis – please, please, please, can we keep her?

We've seen some exciting conductors, but the utterly dyamic Karina Canellakis is **something to behold**. She moves her body sooooo fast at times, with such energy – and strength – for such a tiny body.

If you played a soundless video of Karina conducting Beethoven 5, just from watching her – without an orchestra – you would know EXACTLY what she was conducting.

Karina has an incredible range of facial movements, eye expressions and body movements which she uses to engage the orchestra and express the music. Her hands are intensely expressive, both in movement and in stillness. She is unafraid to express joy and pleasure in her conducting.

The Orchestra appeared to be delighted to be working with Karina - there was a lot of smiling and joy bubbling up from members of the Orchestra during the final movement, and



the audience was simply enthralled. I too would be delighted to work with a conductor who "plays with" the orchestra with sideways glances, and who can express elation, bliss, urging, cajoling, and intense satisfaction.

What a pity that Karina is not available to become the next Conductor of the MSO! (for the next few years at least). We will certainly be keeping a close eye on this amazing talent, and excitedly anticipate seeing her conduct again in the future.

Review - Hoang Pham in Concert - what a fabulous event!

If you missed Hoang Pham's recital for the Geelong Friends of the MSO fundraiser in September last year, well, YOU MISSED OUT!

It was a joyous occasion, performed by a skilled and talented musician, who is eminently approachable, both on and off the stage. Many of us were able to meet Hoang and get to know him a little better after the concert.

A review of the concert follows...



The Friends (GFMSO) fundraising concert last September was a resounding success with an outstanding and thoroughly enjoyable program played by Hoang Pham. Pham has a string of awards to his name, and we were able to appreciate his music-making at the finest level, opening the concert with Beethoven's Pathetique sonata which was both breath-taking and dreamlike.

This was followed by Brahms Intermezzo in A-flat - which brought back memories of all those syncopated bars which I struggled with as a student - but were rapturously played by Pham.

The Rachmaninov Prelude in G minor is a tantalising crowd pleaser, and it proved again to be popular at Pham's hands. Interval was preceded by Chopin's Ballade in G minor leaving us exhausted with the ravishing and scintillating finale.

After a break to recuperate we were presented with Schubert's Sonata in C minor which, from the acclamations at the end, it would seem that many had come only to hear this and been handsomely rewarded.

The set program ended with the Strauss/Schulz-Evier Concert Arabesques on 'The Beautiful Blue Danube' which delighted us all with familiar tunes, willing us to waltz around the piano whilst Pham cast his spell. Coming back for a generous encore Pham played his signature Chopin.

The afternoon was a great success musically and financially thanks to the talent and personal warmth of Hoang Pham.


Boy, do they LOVE Costa Hall!
